

### Early Literacy Extras:

- ✓ Talk about the word "blanket" sound out the different parts of the word "blan" and "ket" – say them separately and then together again, first slowly and then faster. Clap once for each syllable of the word. Do the same thing with words like "bedtime, pajamas, nightgown, and slippers."
- ✓ Help your child think of words that rhyme with "blanket" and like "pocket, basket, biscuit, carpet, cricket, market" – make up silly rhymes with these words.
- ✓ Help your child find things that start with the "B"- "buh" sound (bed, bear, baby, bike, bag, box ) and also the "BL" - "bluh" sound blend (blue, blender, blinds, blouse) all around the house.
- ✓ Find a quilt or patterned blanket. Help your child find all of the different colors, shapes, and patterns. Noticing these differences helps in learning the different shapes of letters and numbers.
- ✓ The sense of rhythm obtained from listening to songs and rhymes will help your child to identify patterns, like rhyming words, which will help them learn to read. Because songs automatically break down words into smaller sounds through tones, singing with your child is one of the best ways develop early literacy skills. Sing songs about blankets and bedtime such as the ones on the following pages.

## ***Songs and rhymes to share:***

### **Oh Me Oh My!** (actions follow words)

At breakfast time  
Milk spilled on my blanket  
Oh Me Oh My!  
Have to wash my blanket  
And hang it out to dry

At lunch time

Oh Me Oh My!  
Have to wash my blanket  
And hang it out to dry

At snack time
